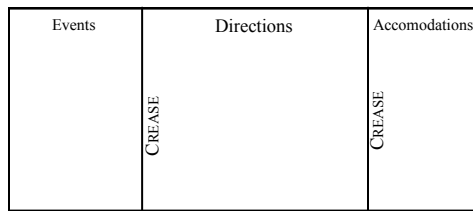


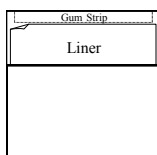
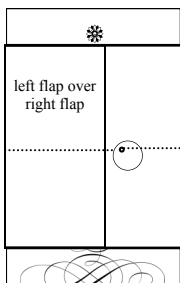
## DIY Assembly Instructions for Wrap Invitations

It is best to create an assembly line and get all of your pieces and parts organized.

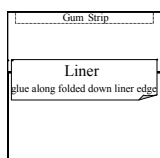
Supplies you will need: Glue stick or adhesive gun and scissors



FOLD INWARD



Line up liner below gum strip. Carefully fold liner and envelope down at



Glue along the edge of folded down liner. Fold envelope flap on top of glued liner and press to adhere.

- 1) Start with the wrap. Fold the wrap where it is pre-creased towards the wording is on the inside.
- 2) Slip your rsvp cards under the flap of the return envelope with the "RSVP" showing.
- 3) Place the RSVP card and envelope in the middle of the wrap.
- 4) Place the invitation card over the RSVP card.
- 5) Fold wrap left side over right side around the cards. It will be a snug fit.
- 6) Take a piece of the precut twine and slip a circle tag through so the tag is centered on the twine.
- 7) Lay the twine with tag across the front of the wrap.
- 8) Flip wrap over and cross the twine over and under like you are tying your shoes. Pull the twine a little to help secure the wrap.
- 9) Wrap the twine around two more times (no need to cross again) ending in the front.
- 10) Tie bow on front and trim ends if needed. *We recommend a bow instead of knot so it is easier for your guests to open.*
- 11) Take colored envelope liner and slide it into envelope - make sure to place the tapered end at the top of the envelope.
- 12) Align the top of the liner just below the gummed strip.
- 13) Holding the liner in place, carefully fold the envelope and liner together at the envelope flap crease.
- 14) Open the envelope back up. Keeping the folded portion of the liner down, glue the top back of the liner with a glue stick or a glue tape gun.
- 15) Fold the envelope flap on top of glued liner and press to adhere.
- 16) You are now ready to address your envelopes and stuff your invitations.
- 17) Be sure to take a completed invitation to the post office to have them determine the appropriate postage.
